The bedroom is where all ten children were born and where Mr and Mrs Kilpatrick slept. This room was also used as the 'good room', anyone who was important such as the Minister or the Inspector for the Lagan Navigation Company would be entertained here rather than the kitchen. The children were allowed in the bedroom at the weekend, which was the only time (except in really cold weather) the fire was lit.
