# Activity: Sticky cards



#### Learning objectives

- To investigate the environment through art.
- To encourage pupils to explore different shapes, colours and textures found in the natural world.





### **Teacher Preparation**

Site visit, risk assessment and preparation of sticky cards

#### Equipment & Resources

Postcard sized piece of card with a strip of double-sided sticky tape horizontally across the middle.

#### Main activity

- 1. This is a fantastic activity for pupils to do as part of a discovery/nature walk or as an exercise within the school grounds. It's also a great way to record their visit.
- 2. Introduce the activity by asking the class how they think they might create a beautiful piece of art without any pencils, paints or crayons.
- Give each pupil a sticky card and get them to peel off the top layer of the double-sided sticky tape, making sure they don't drop any litter.
- 4. Ask the pupils to collect interesting leaves, grasses and twigs and create a picture by placing them on the sticky part of the card.
- 5. A variety of themes can be explored e.g. autumn, seasons, colours, plants, textures.
- 6. Remember it's not permitted to pick wildflowers e.g. bluebells and primroses.

## Safety points

Site visit and risk assessments are essential for this activity. Ensure that the chosen area is free from hazards. Take great care when near water.
