Activity: Match the Leaf Game



Learning objectives

- To observe and identify different tree species in the field.
- To encourage pupils to explore different shapes, colours and textures found in the natural world.
- To encourage pupils to remember each tree species.

20 mins



Teacher Preparation

Site visit, risk assessment and preparation of materials.

Equipment & Resources

- Identification charts
- Bags for collecting leaves
- Maps of Lagan Valley Regional Park

Main activity

This is a great game to accompany a nature walk or a tree study.

- 1. Find a safe area or route for the pupils to use with plenty of native trees.
- Split the group into small teams of 3 or 4. Give each group a collecting bag and an identification chart.
- Ask each group to use their tree charts to identify between 6 and 10 trees. Ask them to put a leaf from each tree into their collecting bag.
- 4. Ask them to study the shape and size of each leaf very carefully as they will need to remember them for the game later.

The Game

- This game can be played both indoors and outdoors.
- Using the leaves that the class collected, place one leaf from each tree in a line at the top of room/field.
- Get the class to form 2 groups and number the individuals in each group so that there's a number 1, 2, 3.... in each team.
- 8. Get each team to stand in a line so that the number 1, 2, 3... are beside one another.
- 9. The aim of the game is that when you call a number and a tree species for example "number 1 oak", both number 1's run from where the team is based to the line of leaves and the first pupil to collect the right leaf wins points for their team.
- Repeat the exercise until each child has had a chance to play.

Site visit and risk assessments are essential for this activity. Ensure that the chosen area is free from hazards. Take great care when near water.
