# Activity: Musical Trees



## Learning objectives

 To encourage pupils to think about the effects of habitat loss and deforestation.





## **Teacher Preparation**

Site visit, risk assessment and preparation of materials.

### Equipment & Resources

- Animal, minibeast and bird masks (this can be done beforehand as an art activity). If you don't have time to make masks sticky labels with animal names will do.
- Chairs
- Music

#### Main activity

This is a great activity to do as part of a physical education session. It can be played with pupils wearing masks of different species or just as an alternative game to musical chairs.

- 1. The rules are the same as musical chairs with the chairs representing trees.
- 2. When the music stops chairs are taken away. Tell the pupils why there are less trees (chairs), storms, timber cut for paper/furniture industry, forest cleared for housing, new road or shopping centre.
- 3. The children in their role as woodland creatures should identify that their homes are being lost.
- 4. At the end of the game get the pupils to sit in a circle to discuss how they felt as woodland creatures.
