# Activity: Tree Identification



#### Learning objectives

- To observe and identify different tree species in the field.
- To encourage pupils to explore different shapes, colours and textures found in the natural world.
- To investigate different habitats.
- To look at different leaves, seeds, buds and berries.

# 20-30 mins



#### **Teacher Preparation**

Site visit, risk assessment, plan a route and photocopy/ laminate ID charts. This activity can be accompanied by several other activities (see below).

### Equipment & Resources

- Identification charts
- Bags for collecting leaves etc.
- Maps of Lagan Valley Regional Park

#### Main activity

- This is a fantastic activity for pupils to do as part of a discovery/nature walk or as an exercise within the school grounds.
- 2. This activity can be carried out at different times of the year as part of a module on seasonal change.
- Have a route planned either in your school grounds or within Lagan Valley Regional Park. (Maps are available to download).
- 4. Encourage the children to use their information sheets and ID charts to identify the native trees they find as they travel along the route.
- 5. Leaves and seeds could be collected to make a collage or record of their work

## Safety points

Site visit and risk assessments are essential for this activity. Ensure that the chosen area is free from hazards. Take great care when near water.
