The Fairy Tree



As you walk along the path you will come to a hole in the hedge where you can take the magic path through the hay meadow.



This is no ordinary tree it is the fairy tree. These trees are deciduous so they loose their leaves in winter. They have thorny branches and bright red berries called 'haws'. The small leaves look like fairy wings. Its flowers appear in May and can be pink and white. Some people call it Mayflower.

Meadow plants

Decide whether the plants below are insect or wind pollinated.













Discovering Hedgerows Laganscape


